- I Adding RPP Zones
  - 1. There must be a clear and reoccurring major impact
  - 2. The proposed hours of restriction must fit the impact
  - 3. 65% of units (one vote per unit) on the block must be in favor
  - 4. Impacts to surrounding blocks must be considered
  - 5. Zones must correspond with the existing neighborhood zone number
  - 6. All other existing requirements of Ordinance 9-64-090 are required
- ▶□ Application Process
  - 1. A petition must be completed with 65% in favor, counting one vote per housing unit. The petition must describe the desired restriction.
  - 2. The petition (and a written description of the parking impacts facing the block) must be submitted to the ward service office.
  - 3. Aldermanic staff will review the situation and contact the residents if any other information is needed (i.e. petition of support from a neighboring block, notice posted to the area)
  - 4. With the Alderman's approval an ordinance would be introduced to City Council
  - 5. The Department of Revenue conducts a survey to verify if it is in fact appropriate to have permit parking on the block.
    - at least 45 percent of the vehicles parked are not owned by residents
    - ▶□ at least 85 percent of available on-street parking is occupied.
  - 6. If approved, it would be recommended to be passed by the City Council.
  - 7. Once the ordinance is passed, an order is sent to CDOT to put up the signs.
